The Industry and Policy Context for Digital Games for Empowerment and Inclusion

Nov 01 2020 The effective use of digital games for empowerment and social inclusion (DGEI) of people and communities at risk of exclusion will be shaped by, and may influence the development of a range of sectors that supply products, services, technology and research. The principal industries that would appear to be implicated are the 'videogames' industry, and an emerging 'serious games' industry. The videogames industry is an ecosystem of developers, publishers and other service providers drawn from the interactive media, software and broader ICT industry that services the mainstream leisure market in games, The 'serious games' industry is a rather fragmented and growing network of firms, users, research and policy makers from a variety of sectors. Can Gender Empowerment Promote Financial Inclusion For Women Jun 28 2020 This paper analyzes the variation in access to and use of financial services for women in approximately 120 countries. Using panel data from the Global Financial Inclusion Index (Global Findex 2017) on account ownership and use of digital payments, I find that gender empowerment can promote financial inclusion for women. Applying cross-country regressions, my results confirm that in countries where women account for a larger share of the labor force and are politically empowered, there will be an increase in the number of women who own an account, and make or receive digital payments. In line with these findings, my study indicates that there is a positive correlation between years of education and women's demands for financial services. Furthermore, my analysis supports the notion that some of the cross-country variation in female account ownership and use of digital payments can be explained by gender norms-related legal protections, such as non-discrimination in employment and equal ownership rights to property. At the same time, the findings of my analysis indicate that lack of security for women, for example as a result of intimate partner violence, significantly prevents women from reaping the benefits of financial inclusion. From a policy perspective, my thesis contributes to a growing literature that studies the relationship between gender empowerment and women's financial inclusion.

Specifically, using panel data from the Global Findex Database (Global Findex 2017), the World Bank's Women, Business and Law Database and Quality of Government Database, I conclude that for countries where women are better educated, and socially and politically empowered, a larger percentage of women have a bank account, use digital transfer and own a credit card. From a policy perspective, the paper underscores the importance of developing financial inclusion infrastructure, enhancing women's financial literacy, and promoting world-wide gender equality.

The State of Economic Inclusion Report 2021 Jun 08 2021 The State of Economic Inclusion Report 2021 sheds light on one of the most intractable challenges faced by development policy makers and practitioners: transforming the economic lives of the world's poorest and most vulnerable people. Does market inclusion empower women? Evidence from

Bangladesh Sep 23 2022 Increased market inclusion through participation in agricultural value chains may increase employment and household incomes, but evidence on its empowerment impacts is mixed. In societies with restrictive social norms, greater market inclusion can enhance existing income and empowerment inequalities by relegating marginalized groups, including women, to low value chains or lower value nodes within those chains. We use primary data from rural Bangladesh to investigate the associations between households' primary economic activity - agricultural wage-earning, production, or entrepreneurship - and absolute and relative levels of men's and women's empowerment. Women in producer households, on average, fare better on empowerment outcomes than women in wage-earner or entrepreneur households; the opposite is true for men. The gap between men's and women's empowerment scores is also lowest in producer households. A decomposition of these results into composite indicators yields insights into potential trade-offs, while accompanying qualitative work highlights the importance of social and cultural norms in shaping

the economic roles women can adopt. With a push towards diversification of agriculture into higher value market-oriented crops, more careful programming is needed to ensure that market inclusion translates into an increase in women's empowerment.

Financial Inclusion, Self-help Groups (SHGs) and Women Empowerment Aug 23 2022 Women's lack of economic empowerment not only impedes growth and poverty reduction, but also negatively impacts education and health outcomes for children. Thus, it is extremely important to ensure that women are economically empowered. The resulting pro-WEAI for market inclusion (pro-WEAI+MI) includes quantitative and qualitative instruments developed over the course of four studies. Studies in the

Philippines (2017), Bangladesh (2017), and Malawi (2019) were intended to diagnose areas of disempowerment to inform programming, whereas the Benin (2019) study was an impact assessment of an agricultural training program. The pro-WEAI+MI includes all indicators included in pro-WEAI, plus a dashboard of complementary indicators and recommended qualitative instruments. These tools investigate the empowerment of women in different value chains and nodes and identify barriers to market access and inclusion that may restrict empowerment for different value chain actors. Our findings highlight three lessons. First, the sampling strategy needs to be designed to capture the key actors in a value chain. Second, the market inclusion indicators cannot stand alone; they must be interpreted alongside the core pro-WEAI indicators. Third, not all market inclusion indicators will be relevant for all value chains and contexts. Users should research the experiences of women and men in the target value chains in the context of the program to select priority market inclusion indicators.

The Abbreviated Women's Empowerment in Agriculture Index (A-WEAI) Apr 26 2020 The fifth Sustainable Development Goal—to "achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls"—reflects a growing consensus that these are key objectives of development policy in their own right, while also contributing to improved productivity and increased efficiency, especially in agriculture and food production. To

deliver on this commitment to women's empowerment in development calls for appropriate measures that can be used to diagnose the scope and major sources of disempowerment and to measure progress. The Women's Empowerment in Agriculture Index (WEAI) is a survey-based tool codeveloped by the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI), the Oxford Poverty and Human Development Initiative, and the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) (Alkire et al. 2013). The index was originally designed as a monitoring and evaluation tool for the U.S. government's Feed the Future initiative to directly capture women's empowerment and inclusion levels in the agricultural sector. Since its launch in February 2012, the WEAI has been implemented in the 19 Feed the Future focus countries. As with any new metric, pilot testing in a few selected countries with limited sample sizes is insufficient to demonstrate how the WEAI would perform when rolled out on a wider scale. Concerns expressed by users of the WEAI led to the creation of an abbreviated version—the A-WEAI. This paper begins by presenting a brief overview of the WEAI and its construction. It then proceeds to discuss (1) the background and motivation behind the creation of the A-WEAI; (2) the steps taken to develop the AWEAI—namely, cognitive testing and piloting of different modules, particularly those that were difficult to administer in the field; (3) analysis of the pilot data from Bangladesh and Uganda; (4) domain-specific comparisons of the different pilot versions; and (5) robustness checks and empowerment diagnostics from the A-WEAI as compared with the original WEAI. The paper concludes by summarizing the modifications to the original WEAI and discussing possibilities for further development of empowerment metrics based on the WEAI.

Connecting Financial Inclusion and ICTs to Women's

Empowerment Jul 30 2020 Global financial inclusion has increased but the gender gap has remained intractable at around seven per cent between 2011 and 2017. This gender gap is also evident in the use of digital channels despite the transformational effect of mobile money and banking on financial inclusion. A policy emphasis on financial inclusion has meant that the unbanked are seen as a market. Much of the debate

and literature focuses on how banking access can be assured in a sustainable way for providers and users. This needs to be complemented by a focus on the empowerment of women and men, giving them the freedom to choose the life they want. The design of financial products and services needs to take account of the 'gender of money'. that is, the way women and men use, manage and control, inherit and own money in different ways across cultures. The one universal trait is that women use more of their money, compared to men, for the welfare of their children and household. So financial inclusion has to work with the social and cultural nature of money and the communication and social worlds of men and women. A focus on empowerment will help dilute the danger of financial inclusion becoming a synonym for a cashless society. The use of information and communication technologies (ICTs) has co-existed with traditional channels of communication and forms of money. Mobile money initially enabled more efficient access to and transmission of cash. ICTs have also over time increased digital financial transactions.
